
Trefoil Guild



Kumihuno / Jellyfish Bracelets


Materials Needed


- Circle of card approximately 12cm diameter; divided into 8 equal sections
- Make a hole centrally and small cuts –approximately 5mm each at the edge of each section
- Embroidery threads x 7




Method

- Tie a knot in the threads hold them together and pull them through the centre hole
- Place a thread in each slit except for that in the 6 o'clock position (red arrow)
- Take the thread from the slit at the green arrow and move it 3 places to the empty slot (red arrow)
- Turn the circle so that the empty slot is once again at the 6 o'clock position
- Repeat – the bracelet 'grows' at the back of the circle and a gentle tug every now and again helps the bracelet to grow evenly






Yellow thread has moved to bottom empty slot

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Macrame People Keyrings or zip pulls



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Macrame People

Materials Needed

- Macrame cord
 - Two lengths
 - ~ 30cm
 - ~ 45 – 60cm
- Wooden beads
- Keyring
- Clip



Method

- Fold the shorter piece of cord in half
- Push it through the hole in the bead



- Then attach the key ring by making a loop and sliding the head through this before tightening



Method

- Lay the longer length under both part of the shorter cord, with the head towards you (you may wish to fix this on the table with Sellotape)



- Take the left-hand piece of cord and lay it over the shorter length as so.



Method

- Take the right-hand bit of long cord and lay it over the left-hand piece as shown



- Then take this piece of cord and pass it under the head and up through the loop you have made on the left-hand side.
- Pull to tighten.



Method

- The process is then repeated but starting with the cord on the right-hand side.
- Passing this firstly over the shorter cord.
- Then taking it over the cord lying on the left-hand side.
- Take this cord under the head and through the loop formed on the right-hand side.
- Pull tight.



Method

- You will notice a pattern of 'V's developing as you continue the process alternating from side to side.
- When you feel you have enough to form the body, push firmly up from the leg end until it is tight against the head.



Method

- Finally tie knots to form hands and feet (and stop the cord from unravelling).
- Trim off the excess and enjoy your little person.



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
